



Postdoctoral Research Fellowship in the Department of Zoology, University of Johannesburg

The Department of Zoology, University of Johannesburg, is a research-active department and currently has a number of Postdoctoral Research Fellowships available. Primary research fields in the department include Aquatic Health, Aquatic Parasitology, Fish Histopathology, Freshwater Ecology, Population Genetics/Genomics, Aquatic Toxicology, Nanotoxicology, Microplastics, Paleontology and Respiratory Morphology.

The department is located on the Auckland Park Kingsway campus. Appointees will engage in full-time postdoctoral research on an approved project with UJ Zoology staff members. The fellowship is renewable for a second year subject to satisfactory progress and available funds. The Postdoctoral Research Fellowships will be awarded on a competitive basis, considering the candidate's academic achievements and to which extent they meet the necessary requirements.

Requirements:

- The candidate must hold a Ph.D. in Zoology or a related field (obtained within the last five years).
- A cover letter highlighting their experience and research interests.
- A complete CV with contact details of three referees.
- Academic transcripts.
- The candidate must not be in full-time employment at the time of taking up the fellowship and for the duration of the fellowship.
- International candidates must please provide a copy of their visa or residence permit.
