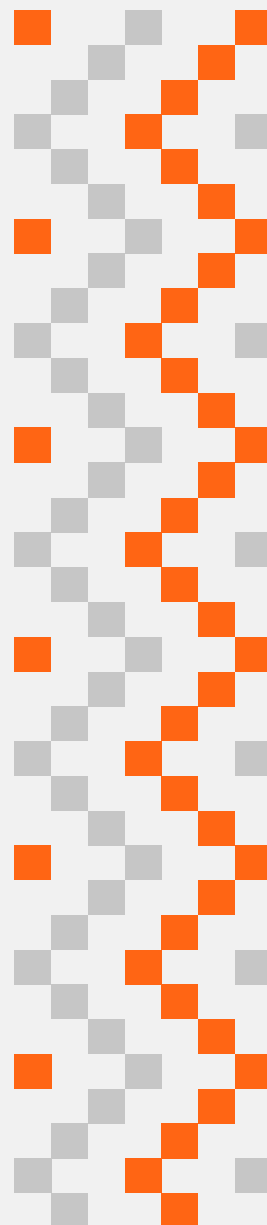

Biographical Note: Professor Wangūi wa Goro is a multidisciplinary/ interdisciplinary, intersectional scholar and public intellectual affiliated to SOAS as Professor of Translation Practice and Visiting Professor at Kings' College London. An acclaimed translator, writer, poet, editor and cultural curator, working across scholarship, community and service in fiction, non-fiction, translation, criticism and review, her work has been recognised with honorary professorships, fellowships, awards, and global engagement.

Best known for her ground-breaking translation of Ngūgī wa Thiong'o's works from Gĩkũyũ and Veronique Tadjo's *As the Crow Flies* (2001 & 2024) from French, she co-edited the seminal text, *Global Feminist Politics, Identities in a Changing World* with Suki Ali and Kelly Coate (2001). Wangūi's life work and commitment is safeguarding and developing African languages, world literatures and heritages, by promoting transnational intersectional freedom through translation and traducture through knowledge management in/and education and cultural practice.
