ACEPS is a tiny centre with 1 full-time director, 13 postgraduates and 70 RAs, that has had a great year both qualitatively and based on a purely numbers metric. According to the latter, ACEPS topped all of UJ's heavily funded and staffed centres and institutes. This success is a continuation from 2023, when ACEPS jumped from obscurity to the 2nd top UJ Centre and Institute all the while learning the ropes and paying school fees.

What did ACEPS do in 2024?

ACEPS leaned heavily on its great team of PhDs and PDRF to pick up the slack and run with the ball, using its extensive network of Research Associates and Visiting Professors.



This synergy allowed tiny ACEPS to be a heavy hitter in the epistemic decolonisation and justice international space, and a major contributor to UJ Humanities success story.

Who did we do it with?

ACEPS partnered with Northwestern via their Buffet foundation initiative, McGill, Quebec, Brandon, Melbourne, ANU, Tilburg, 1 Res ICT Africa, Karlsruhr Inst of Tech, Lima, and New Delhi Universities, hosted 10 self-funded international visitors, and ran 25 workshops.
