GLOBAL SPORT AND DIPLOMACY IN A MEDIATED WORLD



UJ's Centre for Data and Digital Communications (CDDC) in the School of Communication will be hosting a public lecture to explore the relevance and impact of global sports events, with a particular focus on the upcoming 2026 FIFA World Cup to be hosted jointly by the United States, Mexico, and Canada. The lecture will examine the role of sports as a tool for diplomacy.
