Professor Paul Mativenga is the Chair in Multi-scale and Sustainable Manufacturing in the School of Engineering at The University of Manchester and is also a Distinguished Visiting Professor in the Postgraduate School of Engineering Management at the University of Johannesburg. Paul is excited about developing engineering science solutions to the major challenges of resource efficiency and industrial sustainability. His research has been and is funded by the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council (EPSRC), Innovate UK, and Industry. Paul is a member of the International Academy of Production Engineering, College International pour la Recherche en Productique (CIRP). The CIRP was established in 1951 with the goal of scientifically addressing issues related to modern production science and technology through international cooperation. He is also a Fellow of the RSA and holds editorial roles for Elsevier and the Institution of Mechanical Engineers journals in manufacturing science and technology. He holds a chair in Multi-scale and Sustainable Manufacturing in the School of Engineering. He has supervised over 20 PhDs in the UK and has examined more than 20 PhD candidates through face-to-face and online viva. Paul will draw upon experience from different universities.
