

The Annual Banking Law Update (ABLU) is presented by the Centre for Banking Law of the University of Johannesburg. This prestigious event has formed part of the South African (and international) conference calendar since 1978.

TOPICS INCLUDE: food crime as a money laundering typology; artificial intelligence and financial crime management; chatbots; letters of credit; crypto asset regulation; Nigeria's e-Naira; the right of a bank to choose its clients; buffers in affordability assessments; bank conduct risk regulation and supervision; deposit insurance as well as legal updates of interest to bankers on taxation and independent guarantees.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: Advocate Xolisile Khanyile – former director of the South African Financial Intelligence Centre and current Chair of the African Chapter of the Global Coalition to Fight Financial Crime.
